TRENTON — A recent [Rutgers-Eagleton poll](#) asked New Jerseyans which of the following is America's greater problem: income inequality or too much government?

The results were split, despite the state's reputation for being liberal-leaning.

Forty-eight percent of Garden State residents chose the liberal belief that income inequality is a bigger problem, and the same percentage picked the conservative view that too much government is the larger issue.
